Big Bend Groundwater Management District No. 5 Watershed Plan—Environmental Impact Statement

The District has been working with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and its consultant, Olsson, to complete a Rattlesnake Creek Watershed Plan Environmental Impact Statement (Plan-EIS). The Plan-EIS is evaluating a variety of alternatives for dual purposes; to provide long-term agricultural water management and to meaningfully address the impairment of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) senior water right for Quivira National Wildlife Refuge (NWR). Throughout 2024, the draft Plan-EIS has undergone rigorous technical review by NRCS' National Water Management Center. This process has assisted Olsson and the District to ensure the project meets or exceeds NRCS' technical requirements for the Watershed Program. The draft Plan-EIS document has recently been submitted to NRCS-HQ for administrative review. This submission to NRCS-HQ is the final step before being presented to the public for review and comment. The District and coordinating agencies, including but not limited to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, KDA-DWR, and KDHE, have provided meaningful reviews and input into this process. When the draft Plan-EIS document is available, the District will publish it to its website for public review and comment. Olsson, with assistance from the District, will hold a public meeting to present the details of the Plan-EIS and will accept direct comments back from stakeholders. This is all part of the process and it does take time to do it properly. The hundreds of meetings and thousands of hours put into the project will bring this fully-evaluated, sustainable, and fully-funded plan to address the issues in the region. Annual Report Published

Per K.S.A. 82a-1043 the five groundwater management districts submit annual reports to the legislature regarding how expenditures are being used to address water quantity/quality concerns of their respective regions. As a part of this effort, in July 2024, the District identified four areas of concern as well as two supplemental areas under consideration. These include both water quantity and water quality areas. The 2024 annual report and associated areas of concern have been published to our website (<u>https://gmd5.org/annual-report</u>) in accordance with the statute. We encourage all water users in the region to take a good look at these documents and let the District know your concerns.

Water Use Reports Due

The time has come to file your water use report for the 2024 water use year. Filing the annual water use report online (<u>www.kswaterusereport.org</u>) is quick, free, and user-friendly. To utilize the online system, reference the PIN and PERSON ID found on the water use report form mailed to you by KDA–DWR earlier this month. If you would like assistance with filing this report, drop by our office. All District staff are trained in using this system and we can assist you.

Anyone wishing to verify to the District a lesser amount of water used in 2024 must do so by April 1, 2025. Annual assessments are based on the authorized water appropriation of a water right unless otherwise verified. The District will accept the following as verified claims: a) metered values, b) enrollment in CRP with an inactive status, or c) verified claims showing that the well has not been installed.
